A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR: This week I would like to thank those who have already given to the diocese's annual **Catholic Charities Appeal** and urge those who have not done so already to make a donation or a pledge this week.

The Catholic Charities Appeal (CCA) funds many of the pastoral activities of the Church here in Southcoast, from the chaplains at St. Luke's Hospital to the weekly Mass on channel 6. Right next door to our church the CCA helps fund Catholic Social Services' "Donovan House" (the former St. James Convent on Rockland St.), which provides housing and guidance to mothers and children in crisis situations. At the old St. Anne's Convent on Ruth St. the CCA has helped to

Wilson is required. **SPONSOR CERTIFICATES TO BE GODPARENTS:** Godparents **MUST be people who go to Mass Weekly.** If they go here, it would be a good idea to register in the Parish, since it is not easy for the Priest or the Deacon to remember everyone. If they go to Mass at another parish, they should register there. Please pass this information along, so that we don not have embarrassing situations denying sponsor certificates. **When choosing Godparents,** they must be practicing Catholics who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. If they are married, they need to be married in the Church (or with the Catholic Church’s permission in a non-Catholic Church). If they are single, they need to be not “living together” with someone. A non-Catholic can be chosen as one of the sponsors, and would be called a “Christian witness”. They would have to be practicing member of their church. Godparents need to request sponsor certificates from the church they currently attend (not the church of their Confirmation).

GREATER NEW BEDFORD MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS, a group of medical and non-medical volunteers trained to respond to major emergency situations, participated in a Mass Casualty Incident Drill in New Bedford. The disaster scenario was of such great magnitude that the emergency response teams and hospital systems required the support services of the Medical Reserve Corps. The MRC's primary objective during this exercise was to test its internal Incident Command System, deployment protocol, and its communications alert network. Louise Donaghy, R.N., NB Health Department public health nurse and Coordinator of the Greater New Bedford MRC stated, "Participating in drills like this help to build the MRC's capacity to activate and mobilize our corps of volunteers to respond quickly in any emergency or disaster that may occur in the Greater NB area." The Greater New Bedford MRC continues to **recruit all citizens interested in aiding with its mission to be prepared** in advance of a real disaster situation. "We welcome and need volunteers who possess a variety of skills, from all walks of life," she said. **For every one medical person recruited by the MRC, ten non-medical individuals are needed.** The Greater New Bedford Medical Reserve Corp Motto is, "Disaster Can Strike At Any Time.
